Little Children—Big Ideas

In cardigan sweater and sneakers, Mr. Rogers has entertained and educated children and parents in the not so often explored arena of heart and mind. His thoughts live on through countless articles and an online newsletter overseen by Hedda Sharapan that cover a variety of topics from the importance of silence to nurturing a love of learning.



Here is some food for thought as we approach the Thanksgiving holiday with a sampling of words of wisdom imparted by Mr. Rogers over his many years as an educator and media personality:

"Learning about language begins long before kindergarten -- when we talk and sing with children, when we tell them the names for things around us... when we help them see that reading helps us in our everyday lives."

"Deep within us—no matter who we are—there lives a feeling of wanting to be lovable, of wanting to be the kind of person that others like to be with. And the greatest thing we can do is to let people know that they are loved and capable of loving."

"Anyone who does anything to help a child in his life is a hero to me."

"Haven't you found that one of the best ways children learn is from the example of the grownups they love? When children see that you wonder about the world around you ...that you ask questions...that you notice things and look carefully, then they'll want to be curious about the world around them, too."

"Above all, I think that the willingness and the courage to keep on trying develops best if there is someone we love close by who can lend us some of the strength we do not yet have within ourselves. We all need quiet, caring cheerleaders like that -- grownups as well as children."

"Anything that we can do to help foster the intellect and spirit and emotional growth of our fellow human beings, that is our job. Those of us who have this particular vision must continue against all odds. Life is for service."

"One of the greatest dignities of humankind is that each successive generation is invested in the welfare of each new generation."

"We all have different gifts, so we all have different ways of saying to the world who we are."

"The greatest gift you ever give is your honest self."

"We don't always succeed in what we try—certainly not by the world's standards—but it's not the honors and the prizes and the fancy outsides of life which ultimately nourish our souls. It's the knowing that we can be trusted, that we never have to fear the truth, that the bedrock of our very being is good stuff."

"How many times have you noticed that it's the little quiet moments in the midst of life that seem to give the rest extra special meaning?"

"There are three ways to ultimate success: The first way is to be kind. The second way is to be kind. The third way is to be kind."
